

The Diocese of Bethlehem Gathering Protocols Update, May 20, 2021

Dear Friends in Christ,

In anticipation of the full promise of Easter, we read:

When the day of Pentecost had come, they were all together in one place all of them were filled with the Holy Spirit. Acts 2:1,4

For over a year, we in the Diocese of Bethlehem have journeyed together through difficult times that brought death and despair to so many friends and loved ones. Initially, we hoped for a quick resolution to the pandemic, only to be repeatedly disappointed and frustrated. Fears of all kinds mounted as months passed. Now we see that, perhaps, this was our time of waiting – anxious, and fearful – as those first disciples. But soon we celebrate Pentecost, the day the disciples were "filled with the Holy Spirit," and experienced a new beginning in power they could not imagine before.

As predicted by health experts, new COVID-19 cases have begun to trend down as vaccination rates trend up across the diocese. Additionally, the increasing body of scientific knowledge about COVID-19 enables us to suggest simpler guidelines and recommendations for gathering, as well as relaxed protocols for fully vaccinated people.

The Episcopal Diocese of Bethlehem acknowledges the diverse circumstances that exist within its borders. As the program of vaccination against COVID-19 progresses, local conditions will vary. Consequently, diocesan leadership has every confidence that vestries and clergy throughout the diocese will make reasonable and responsible decisions concerning the resumption of worship and other parish activities according to local circumstances. To facilitate that process, the diocese stands ready to offer any specific guidance or resources that may be needed. While the guidelines for a parish to gather indoors remain the same, we suggest that after opening, a parish need not close again unless there is an unanticipated and significant increase in new COVID-19 cases. Only in the unforeseen case of significant increase in new cases will the Bishop and diocesan leadership bodies suggest that parishes consider halting indoor gathering.
