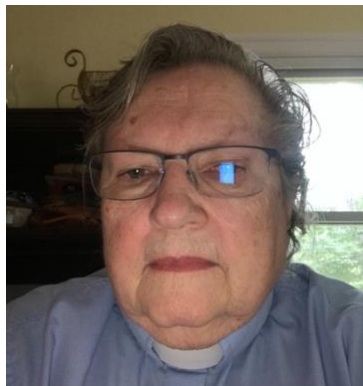


Diocesan Convention Nominees for 2022

General Convention Deputy Lay (Elect 4 for 3-year term)

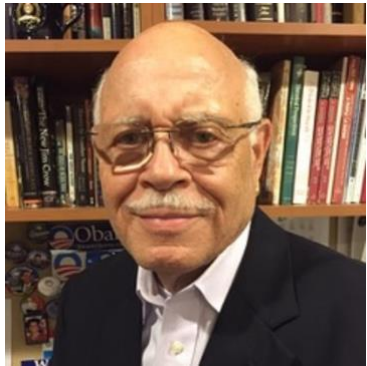

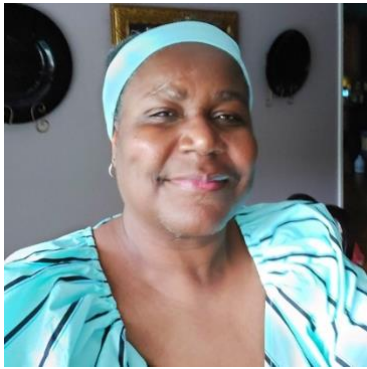
