

May you find the quiet peace of God in our midst.




Mission Statement of the Church of the Epiphany

We see a bright horizon ahead. The setbacks of the pandemic forced us to invest in our future by modernizing our traditional approach to worship. We built a new studio within the church to broadcast our services online. This unique system, which has been nationally recognized as being at the forefront of technology, allows for remote &/or homebound parishioners to actively join in the service including as lay readers, or simply as a participant, able to chat after the service with other parishioners both at home and on the premises.



Our parish has a seamless blend of music and liturgy. The church is more "low Episcopalian". That is not to say that we shy away from appropriate rituals and ceremonies when the occasion calls.

Highlighted by a custom pipe organ, our service enjoys traditional Christian music directly from the 1982 Episcopal Hymnal and similar Hymnals from other faiths, as well as numerous musical selections sung by our talented choir. For over 30 years Epiphany sent our youths to the National Acolyte Festivals held at the National Cathedral in Washington, D.C.

We participate in the Appalachia Service Project in West Virginia to aid less fortunate families hit hard by poverty and natural disasters.

Virtually all our parishioners know the kids on a first name basis. Our Sunday School program is designed to teach our children respect and reverence in a joyful atmosphere, while learning the stories of the Bible. They are encouraged at a young age to take part in our services as lay readers. All of them participate in the annual Christmas pageant.

Our Youth program is intertwined with our Acolyte program. The children are treated with respect as adults. They in return recognize that there is a time and place for fun and worship.





At the end of each school year, we have Youth Sunday. This is a celebration of our youth where the older students conduct the entire church service. One lucky graduating senior is selected to give a sermon. The day culminates with the awarding of the Lawrence Ketchen Scholarship to all graduating seniors.

We are always sad to see them leave, but take solace knowing that we, as a church community, have prepared them for life.









Spiritual Nurturing & Pastoral Care

For I was hungry, and you gave me food, I was thirsty, and you gave me drink, I was a stranger, and you welcomed me, I was naked, and you clothed me, I was sick, and you visited me, I was in prison, and you came to me. - $\underline{\text{Matthew 25:35-40}}$

As a congregation we are looking for an open-minded leader that has a strong commitment to Spiritual Nurturing. Someone who believes in the power of the Eucharist, can promote a deeper prayer life for our members and be engaged with scripture. We have had several ongoing programs of Spiritual Nurturing: Adult forums, Christian education for school aged children, a special small children's church service, Lenten Studies, Whitting Tree for our Veterans, Blessing of the Animals, Stations of the Cross during Holy week, Christmas caroling to our homebound, and lay ministries.

Community Outreach partially occurs through two committees within Epiphany that work to aid the needy:

Agape is a parish discretionary fund to help those in the parish or beyond who find themselves in need of financial assistance, either in an emergency or longer term. Agape is partially supported by the church budget and partially by contributions from parishioners' monthly envelopes.

Christian Outreach/Disaster Relief Fund is set up through an endowment to support regional, national, and global projects that help meet people's physical and spiritual needs. Samples of the latest grants provided aid to Ukraine, a women's resource center, a local mission to the homeless, an organization for disabled children, and several food banks.

In addition to these gifts to the community from our committees, members give substantially of their time and talent as well. 

We are blessed with a wonderful historic traditional church building in the New England style, surrounded by 25 acres of lush, mostly wooded grounds. Our modern Parish Hall houses a large Fellowship Hall complete with Cathedral ceiling and portable stage, a new Commercial Kitchen, 9 classrooms, a casual commons room with fireplace for smaller group meetings, church offices, multiple storage rooms, and four restrooms.

Outside, we have recently built a large picnic pavilion and a substantial firepit. There is the All-Saint's Memorial Garden along with the Woodlands Memorial Garden and Columbarium. Both of these are unmarked burial grounds for cremated remains in a natural setting.

Our church grounds host one of the entrances to the Rails to Trails network. This affords us a very public face. In the past few years, we have made numerous improvements. Each of these additions gives us an opportunity for rental income.

We have one tenant. the Hemlock Hill Academy, which is an educational support program focusing on science and nature, for children who are home schooled. We enjoy a warm symbiotic relationship which greatly benefits the church.

As each has received a gift, use it to serve one another, as good stewards of God's varied grace.



Our parish is mindful of our need for stewardship. We have approximately 100 members and this year we were able to increase our pledges. We are blessed with a strong endowment and the income from it has made it possible to maintain our \$250,000 budget. We are exploring additional forms of income. We are a very generous church. We share our endowment income to support the diocese, local charities and individuals in need.

Our stewardship truly encompasses time, talent and treasure. We long to see our church grow so new dreams can be realized.

STAFF

We have a dedicated staff of paid employees and volunteers. They include a Parish Administrator, Music Director, and a Social-Media Director. In addition, we have a full Vestry of nine parishioners including Sr. and Jr Wardens and parish officers.

Our Community

The Church of the Epiphany is located in a community known as "The Abingtons." It is a residential suburb of Scranton, Pennsylvania. We are 104 miles from Philadelphia and 121 miles from New York City. We have an excellent highway system and are served by the Wilkes Barre/Scranton International Airport. (AVP)

History - The area is rich in heritage because at one time the area was the anthracite capital of the world and the producer of the steel rail that opened the west. The Steamtown National Park and the Anthracite Museum reflect that history.

Several other museums reflect the arts. We have a philharmonic orchestra, ballet company, Broadway Theatre League, countless choral groups, and community theatre troupes, and a Chamber music society. We have an abundance in recreational facilities, including a minor league baseball team, several ski resorts, hiking trails and countless lakes and waterways for kayaking and canoe trips.

Education – The church is in the Abington Heights School District which is the highest ranked school district in the Scranton Metropolitan area. It is ranked in the top 50 schools in the state and in the top 10% of public schools in the country. Scranton metropolitan area has six colleges, the Geisinger Commonwealth Medical School, along with 213 other colleges within a 100-mile radius.

Health Care – Three hospitals are within blocks of each other in Scranton with satellites in the Abingtons.

Recreation – We are within four miles of the Lackawanna State Park, and have a Triple A Yankee baseball team, an AHL Hockey team, water parks, several ski resorts, as well as tennis and golf courses in the area. There are hunting and fishing lands, Rail to Trails walkways, lakes, and rivers, and plenty of sports teams for young people, along with a meandering stream right on our own property.

It is a wonderful place to raise a family.
